In 2005, the Law Enforcement agencies seized and removed from illegal circulation 9,607 weapons, of which 7,195 were smoothbore weapons, 1,118 were gas weapons, 344 were homemade weapons, and 950 were rifle-bored weapons; they included 13 fully automatic weapons, 532 rifles and carbines, 33 combined weapons, and 372 pistols and revolvers.

For 2005, 6,037 units of weapons were voluntarily surrendered. They included 618 rifle-bored weapons, 4,348 smoothbore weapons, 989 gas weapons and 82 homemade weapons.

In 2005 totally were destroyed 5,563 weapons, including: 7 fully automatic weapons, 152 pistols, 228 revolvers, 347 rifles, 44 carbines, 30 combined weapons, 3,605 smoothbore weapons, 980 gas weapons, and 170 homemade weapons.
